

contract with the mother to live up to the agreement that she's with, where we're making an agreement with her and I don't see anybody, when we talk about the \$8 million for ethanol, everyone says, well, that's a contract,...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...we made that agreement, but I don't see anybody going back trying to cut that back. So let's be realistic here when we're talking about the money. Yes, it is the money and the last thing I'll say that I thought was very offensive in that World-Herald editorial, it says the magnitude of the problem is depressing because three zip code zones in northeast Omaha alone contain 3410 families on welfare. There's the crux of the matter. My friends, there it is, that we are worried about northeast Omaha. There are I think around 2,500 cases on the books in the Adams County area, that's Hastings. I think, Senator Bohlke, is that about right, about 2,500? So look at it. It isn't just northeast Omaha. We're talking about the whole state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, with the assistance of one of my colleagues in the culture corner over here, I have some information that I'm going to read to Senator Pirsch, 42-328, and this was put on the books in 1922 in Nebraska. This is what it says. Upon the dissolution by decree or sentence of nullity of any marriage that is prohibited on account of consanguinity between the parties or of any marriage between a white person and a Negro, the issue of the marriage shall be deemed to be illegitimate. That's Nebraska statute. Then, and you can have a copy of it, coming up to 1941 this is 13-115. In any local law, ordinance, or resolution or in any public or judicial proceeding or in any process, notice, order, decree, judgment, record or other public document or paper the terms bastard or illegitimate child shall not be used, but the term child born out-of-wedlock shall be used in substitution therefore and with the same force and effect which is the law, 13-115. The terms were found to be so embarrassing to the state that a law was passed in 1941 prohibiting their use in official documents. There have been very cruel times in this country and there still are but during those cruel times they were a bit more honest. They stated what they actually felt, but by telling the truth, they held themselves up to such
