SENATOR BROMM: You reduced General Funding in the clean air area by 350,000?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Some of the others coming in were maybe cash and federal funds also so I want you to understand. I don't know exactly where all the ten came from. They could be other cash or federal fund issues, but we did reduce General Fund by 350,000, as this cash fund picks up.

SENATOR BROMM: Overall, what is the DEQ budget doing then?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It goes from, in the General Fund it goes down from 24...\$2,452,757 to 2,139,424. That's on page 141, by the way.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So that's approximately 323,000. We did reallocate some of that 350 to another budget in the General Funds, but this General Fund in this area goes down that much.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Just short of 350.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, if Senator Bromm had let this cat alone I would not be stroking it, but I've got to ask Senator Wehrbein a question or two now.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.
