SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I really don't know. Maybe, Senator Wehrbein, do you have any information on that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I haven't read this in detail. There is one that we have, I understand, have to test for at the present time or at least being proposed to test for is a herbicide or insecticide or some kind of herbi..insecti...at least some kind of chemical that's used on pineapple in Hawaii that we have to test for in Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's water though. Well, that's...we're talking about water, aren't you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Yes. Now is the only source of this, and I put it on quotes, "cide", whatever kind it is, Hawaii so
