of the Colleges and the community colleges they don't at this point, and you probably don't even know, exactly what the costs are going to be so that I was just curious how you came up with the 50,000.

SENATOR HILLMAN: I think it was the agency's estimate that they thought probably there might be that amount of transactions that could be coming up in the year and that's what they based that on. It's an estimate.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.

SENATOR HILLMAN: And, of course, if the money doesn't come in, they won't spend it, but they only have the authority to spend \$50,000 of the cash funds.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. I appreciate that and I support the...support the advancement. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Madam Chairman, members of the body, Senator Hillman, would you answer a question?

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR WITEK: I was reading the fiscal note, too, and it mentioned something about charging fees. Are they giving you any estimation for how much the fees? Is this just the start of this fund and then they will start charging fees? Is that how this is going to be working?

Distance learning is fairly new in this state.
