SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It is in this bill, isn't it?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: LB 393.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, excuse me, the per diem are in 392.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So in 393... well, let me understand, make...okay, so in this bill before us, 393, expenses are not included.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What is included in this amount?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Salary and Social Security for Senators.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how much is paid for each Senator per year for Social Security, if you know?
