

SENATOR PIRSCH: And I would like to lay this over. I think that we will have something that we can all agree to and find appropriate.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The bill will be laid over. The body will stand at ease while we locate the next senator for the bill. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Madam President, thank you. Senator Lindsay would like to print amendments to LB 392; Senator Bernard-Stevens would like to print amendments to LB 392. And that's all that I have at this time, Madam President. (See pages 2030-31 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. At this time, we will pass over LB 189 and LB 189A and Senator Engel should be here shortly to begin discussion on LB 425.

CLERK: Madam President, 425, the Enrollment and Review amendments have been considered and have been adopted. There is pending an amendment by Senator Engel. Senator, your amendment is on page 1791 of the Journal, AM1738. It was discussed, I believe, on May 4, at least for a period of time. But that amending is now pending, AM1738, on page 1791.
