SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, again, Senator Wickersham has been very persuasive and has convinced me to vote for this amendment. I'm beginning to have wonderings as to whether, because it's getting kind of late in the afternoon, that my resistance is down or if it's just that Senator Wickersham is presenting such an overwhelming collection of facts that it's impossible to gainsay or deny what he is presenting. So I'm going to have to vote with him again. But, Senator Wickersham, it may change pretty soon.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yeah, we'll see how it goes on the next part.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: Madam Chairman and members of the body, you know, when my little grandson, Markie, used to say, he was about three years old, when something happened, he said, I am "sceered, grandpa". And when Senator Chambers agrees so easily, I am also "sceered", but thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Engel. Any further discussion on the second part? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham. He waives closing. The question is the adoption of the second part of this amendment to LB 425. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. There is a request for a record vote and we are voting on the second section. Would...have you all voted? Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: I believe we better have a call of the house.

SENATOR CROSBY: Request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, opposed no.

SENATOR ENGEL: Call-ins would be fine.

SENATOR CROSBY: Record, please.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR CROSBY: The house is under call. Would all senators please record your presence. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record your presence, and would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Bernard-Stevens, thank you. Senator Bohlke, Senator Matzke.
