PRESIDENT ROBAK: Excuse me, we turn now to LB 330.

CLERK: Madam President, 330, Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to return the bill. (AM1977 appears on page 2039 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Bernard-Stevens to open on his motion.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Briefly, I'd just like to bring the bill back for a specific amendment and I'll yield the rest of the time to Senator Landis.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Madam Speaker, members of the Legislature, David and I have agreed to talk about an amendment he'd like to offer. I joined with him in asking that the bill be brought back. We'll have a very brief dialogue about the amendment, point out two points of view, let the body decide so if you would, let's call the bill back and we'll have a very brief discussion on the amendment and then take a vote on it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Is there any discussion on the motion to return to Select File? Seeing none, Senator Bernard-Stevens, do you wish to close? Closing is waived. The question before you is the motion to return to Select File. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 330 returns to Select File. The Chair recognizes Senator Bernard-Stevens to open on the amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, this is the abortion amendment now that should be noncontroversial that you all voted for, no. When the bill actually started from the Department of Economic
