

employees, and I don't know if they'd want to transfer or not. We should write this bill to cover all contingencies. And so I do believe that we do need to offer some language either here or on Select File, if the bill goes forward, that would take care of that contingency where you didn't have volunteers. I do believe that what we are doing here is really kind of topsy-turvy. If you look at this whole, whole amendment, we just kind of let the Foster Care Review Board and Social Services trade places to some extent, and my question is, who will review the reviewers? Well, we know that in the bill later on it talks about the Department of Social Services reviewing what the Foster Care Review Board does. Does that really change anything? Have we solved the problem, or have we just reversed the situation, and do we still let this thing fester and go on? I don't think so. I would ask for your support on this amendment. I think there does need to be some better language put in here. I will offer some. I don't know if it will take care of the problem. I am not sure we can take care of the transfer problem, but at least we can strike out this language that's rather ambiguous. Thank you.
