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that we are eliminating the role of another review, these are the people that are doing the reviews. So if we're going to eliminate that review, that internal review that isn't public to anybody, we should...what will those people be able to...be doing? If we eliminate that review, which they are doing full-time,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I understand.

SENATOR AVERY: ...then what would they be doing?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay then, but those are basically the employees you were thinking would fill those employee slots over at Foster Care Review Board.

SENATOR AVERY: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, what if they don't want to go?

SENATOR AVERY: If you not...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: What are you going to do then?

SENATOR AVERY: If you notice, there's provision in there that others that have child care or child welfare experience...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, stop right there. Those ten, let's say of those ten people, those review specialists, that half of them decided they would like to go over to foster care, okay, you've got five of them over there, you take five more from somewhere within the social services agency, what do you do with those five people that you haven't moved over, who are the review specialists?

SENATOR AVERY: I would say that is...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Are they fired? Are they out of luck? In other words, does their choice get down to, you know, you move or you're fired?

SENATOR AVERY: I would say that's the department's decision, DSS's decision. Senator Landis may have an answer, he had done something in this. I...it's the decision of the department.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Landis, would you like to respond.
