Now that was pretty well settled, DSS was going to allow their caseworkers to do it, it means they would pay overtime, it means...or they would have to take comp time, which might mean more employees. That's not been addressed in the fiscal note. If those caseworkers are going to be part of the random...or be a part of the review, if they're going to go, what is that going to cost DSS in personnel time? They have a volunteer board, these are good, but we understand one of the problems has always been they cannot, most of the time, the volunteers cannot meet during eight to five hours, which means it has to be either overtime for those caseworkers or...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time.

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...comp time. I'll continue this because I still have some more questions on staffing.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Waive.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, because everything that is offered as an amendment is so intimately interconnected with everything else in this bill I won't deal exclusively with Senator Hall's amendment, although traditionally I won't just deal with an amendment anyway. But I don't want Hall to feel that Oats is breaking up the team because that's not my intent. But I want to ask a question of...oh Senator Bernard-Stevens is not available. But the question, if he is anywhere near and can come to his mike, was he saying that even if these employees are transferred from DSS, that DSS would still need to replace those employees because there is work they would have to do? I wanted to ask him if that is what he said, so if he's anywhere near, well, I'll turn on my light again, if I don't get him this time. But Senator Pirschn touched on something that I was thinking, if I heard her correctly, she was saying that perhaps DSS is too large, has too many things to do and it's difficult for them to zero in on this issue. If that's what she said, I agree with that. And I had been discussing that with some of the other senators over here. The Foster Care Review Board has one responsibility and that is to look at this area affecting children in foster care. At DSS
