I feel that we have no idea, we don't have a clue as to what is going to be done on the fiscal side in creating a new agency. All of those costs, believe me, are not going to be shifted from DSS. We're only talking about eight or ten employees from DSS in that shift that's going to be done. I think it's extremely important that we have a fiscal note for the amendment before we make any decision whatsoever, plus all the other things, I think, that go along with this bill. But the fiscal note is one of the first things that I really think needs to be explained.
