SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I'd like to follow up on a couple of questions that I had of Senator Avery. Senator Avery, in our discussion a little bit earlier we were talking about the fact that envisioned here are three boards per specialist. In other words, each specialist would have a responsibility to oversee three of these boards, is that correct?

SENATOR AVERY: Yes, (inaudible).

SENATOR SCHIMEK: At present time, my question is, at present time there are 20 employees the Foster Care Review Board has. Right now they have 28 boards. So if you were to use that 3 for 1 formula, they need about 9 of those employees right now for oversight of those review boards. And I'm assuming that's what they do right now.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Avery.

SENATOR AVERY: Thank you. Senator Schimek, I've got a breakdown. Twenty-one employees, but not all are full-time, 15 are full-time, of that there's 3 that all they do is serve to maintain the tracking system that is used by many of the people throughout the state to make sure we know where these children are, and that was one of the main problems, why they were created, that we had in losing children. So actually 12 FTE remain to serve as review specialists for 28 boards.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, but that's still 3 more than the allotment that you're envisioning here for 26 more boards. I mean you're going to do those other 26...or 26 boards with fewer
