

answered. I don't think it's a process that is as complicated as many are making it. The...in terms of the reviews, in terms of bringing the individuals up to speed, part of the reason we had the transition is to allow that education process to take place and have...and have DSS spot check, spot check the process in that interim to make sure that we don't lose anything. So, overall in the process, in terms of the costs, it was reported in the reviews and in the committee, the interim study, costs were brought forward, I do not think they were accurate. We have a process here of reviews. There's a quality review and then there's a partial review. We don't know what kind of review that is. I think in the years that have been I'll bet there hasn't been one review where the internal review disagreed with the plan. Now that's not a very good check. Those aren't the type of reviews that we are looking for. We want to make sure that the check is there, and I don't think that in the review process that Foster Care has agreed completely with the 70 percent, or 60 percent that have gone out. In partial, they agree, so there's always going to be that contention. So, as many has made out, in looking at some of the figures and in terms of what Senator Day had said, the cost of doing reviews, in looking purely at just the review specialists I have a cost of \$95 for a Foster Care Review and a DSS review is greater than that.

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR AVERY: So we're always going to have these. I don't know if we can ever, out of DSS, get some of the accurate figures, but this is the policy and this is a policy decision. I think it's the way to go. We went 12 years looking at trying to work together. There is not going...we've had pilot projects say it's been a long 12-year pilot project to see if we can get them together. It isn't going to happen. So I oppose Senator Hall's amendment and hope the rest of the body would do the same. Thank you.
