LB 389, 390

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to advance LB 389 to E & R Final.

SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor vote aye; opposed vote nay. It is advanced. LB 390.

CLERK: LB 390, Senator, I do have E & R amendments pending.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 390.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. All in favor vote aye; opposed. They are adopted. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator Wehrbein as Chair of the Appropriations Committee would offer an amendment found on page 2066.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, this has to do with two issues. The first one is in Legislative Council, Agency 3. This amendment reallocates funds among programs within the Legislative Council. There is no net fiscal impact and the original \$444,785 General Fund reduction currently in the bill remains intact. This reallocation will cover a shortfall in program 126, Revisor of Statutes, due to a large printing cost for reissue of Volumes III, IIIA and IIIB, Volumes V and VA in the 1994 Supplement. Further, this reallocation will even out the unexpected balance for reappropriation purposes, computerization, and/or full funding of salaries. For example, program 122 is projected to have an \$1,100 unexpended balance due largely to the computer project and absorption of the telephone lawsuit costs, and I have a detailed breakdown. We're allocating \$210,000 to Legislative Services; we're subtracting 250 from Clerk of the Legislature; Revisor of Statutes gets a plus 90,000; Intergovernment Cooperation is a deduction of 50. So once again, it's a reallocation of between programs of a total amount of money of \$444,785, has no impact on the General Fund, simply a reallocation among the Legislative Council action. The other
