

for that reason it ought not be adopted. Maybe what the rural senators need to realize is that with having a bill that includes companies hiring as many as 250 people, they again are going to be on the short end of the stick. They are used as the rallying point to justify an approach, then when concrete legislation is drafted to carry out that approach we find them being dropped out of the equation. So maybe this is an amendment that ought not to be adopted. I am offering it though, and I'm going to do like Senator Bernard-Stevens said he's going to do, I'm going to watch the votes that go up on the board. And if Senator Avery...I meant if Senator Engel is smart, he will not be tricked by reverse psychology into supporting this amendment. I think that since you said you're opposed to it, you ought to vote against it. And I think all of those you persuaded to be against it...I think Senator Hillman ought to vote against it. I know Senator Jensen will vote against it, so there should not be much likelihood of this amendment being adopted. But I do want to vote on it because the amendment will be printed. There will be a record vote because I'm going to ask for a roll call vote. Then if this bill is passed, I have that record that I'm always talking to you all about, and you wonder why I always say I'm speaking for the record, and I want a record, I want to be able to show people what you all did. And I want to be able to talk to people who said they represent farmers and small towns and those in rural communities who need help and say that the Legislature is always doing for Micron but won't do anything for their area. I want to show the kind of bill that was before us and how I tried to bring it into a form where it would help theirs. But their senators are the ones who said, no, this is not to be done. We like to be in a position to whine about the rural-urban split and how the east side of the state gets everything, how they don't even propose programs that help the western part of the state. Now Senator Bernard-Stevens tried to get a little piddling \$25,000 out there and that was smashed. You all aren't even worth \$25,000. So then we have this ambitious program designed to help your area and we build into it language that can help these large companies, and you're left in the lurch again. The amendment is before you. Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house and then a roll call vote.
