

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. Will all members please return to their seats, record their presence. All members outside the body please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senators Abboud, Bernard-Stevens and Matzke. Senator Bernard-Stevens, thank you. Senator McKenzie, Brashear and Bromm. Senator Pedersen, Robinson and Cudaback. Senator Maurstad, thank you. Senator Schrock, Senator Hillman. Senator Wickersham, please record your presence, thank you. Senator Schrock, Senator Abboud. Senator Bromm, if you'd record your presence, please. Thank you very much.
