

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to do it, he is right to do exactly what he does. But I speak the way that I do on the floor to let him know that I'm separated from that group. And the things he can say about you all and be telling the truth do not apply to me. I won't duck my head and be quiet or go running out of here because I don't want to hear it and I don't want to stand up to it and because it's embarrassing to me, I'm not going to behave in a way that's embarrassing to me. And I'm never embarrassed to throw it in the face of these grown people who are going to let another mere mortal convert them into Jello. He has contempt for you, he's showing me what you are, so why do you get offended if I treat you the way he told me you should be treated, the way he treats you and you show that you like it? I'm trying to make you happy, and you make people happy by giving them what you...what they like. And you like to be slapped down.

SENATOR HALL: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I'm following the Governor's...

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, first I'd like to respond to Senator Bernard-Stevens. He's making predictions into the future where...because he says he knows, and I think last year I referred to a person I've read a great deal about, used to anyhow, I haven't read him for a few years, but he predicted the future, his name was Nostradamus. So perhaps Senator Bernard-Stevens can start writing some quatrains like Nostradamus did because he can predict what's really going to happen. The rest of us, we kind of hope things will happen and plan on them, but we don't say they actually will happen. So I don't think I take a lot of stock in what he says is going to happen. If it does, he's another Nostradamus. Another thing, as far as this particular amendment goes I see nothing wrong with that. But Senator Bernard-Stevens is talking about the bill, so that's what I'd like to talk about is that what you have to remember is that most of this is going to be revolving loans. Senator Bernard-Stevens asked for an amendment in there to put a sunset on it, and I like sunsets on anything that has to do with money down here, and so...the year 2000. So any monies coming back into this pot, so to speak, will be put into the General Fund, they will not be used anyplace else. So it's
