

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Is there anyone else who cares to speak to the Wickersham amendment? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham, you are recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President, and I will try to be brief. Didn't bring this amendment to offend Senator Chambers. I think I bring this amendment to be consistent with the position I took on General File, in part, and in part to clean up language in the bill. There may be other language that needs to be cleaned up. Apparently the body is willing to work on that. Senator Chambers has indicated he wants to work at that. I think Senator Beutler is indicating he wants to work at it. I've wanted to work at it. This is simply one more step in that process. I would ask your vote to adopt the amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. You've heard the close. The question is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment to LB 425. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I don't know how many times I should ask you to ring the bill and let them know that class is back in session, but in lieu of that, I will ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR HALL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. All members please return to the Chamber, record their presence, the house is under call. All members inside the Chamber, please return to your seats, record your presence. All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. The house is under call. Members, please return to the Chamber, record your presence, the house is under call. Call-in votes are authorized on adoption of the Wickersham amendment.
