SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Senator Hall. Members, LB 871 is my priority bill for this year and it's an omnibus water bill that was brought forth from the Natural Resources Committee. It contains several important things that need to be done for the State of Nebraska in the area of water legislation in metering, in some certificates for abandoning and replacing wells, for priority dates and well fields for the municipal well fields in the state, for holding in abeyance appropriations of water until LB 108 is discussed and conjunctive water use is taken care of. And we have several amendments that we have been working on and the one that we're currently looking at that I would ask unanimous consent to bring to the attention of the body is AM2023 that I and Senator Bromm have sponsored, cosponsored, and would ask consent to substitute AM2023 for that.

SENATOR HALL: If there is no objection, so ordered. Mr. Clerk, AM2023.

CLERK: Well, Senator, I don't have AM2023, I'm sorry. I've got 20...

SENATOR ELMER: I think it's printed in the Journal.

CLERK: Well, give me a moment, Senator.
