SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That they have to recount back. You're going to give a report to the commission about what...what happened for the past year?

SENATOR BROMM: I would have the feeling that this were less of a creation of a bureaucracy if...if the wording were...if the words division were maybe worded differently...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...and I may...I may work with you, if you're agreeable, to some language that might make that more...more of a list of the responsibilities that we expect them to do rather than creating divisions. And I guess maybe...maybe that's just my impression but I...it seems to me when we talk about creating divisions we're talking about perhaps giving the impression this is a big...another big part of a commission and so I...I may want to...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I've got to tell you that after the discussion we've had on the floor I can't envision how that would occur. I really can't. You know, after General File debate and now, I mean, there's nobody who's advocating that. In fact, every amendment that's been done has been done to limit this and so I...I mean, I think that it's fine to put that into a record and I agree, but I think that we've really charted the course for this thing, that this has been scaled back dramatically and that you need some basic...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ..divisions.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen, you're recognized to close on your amendment.
