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dollars to adequately operate what they think they're going to operate on currently.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: So we're actually not just...it's not just a vacancy fund, it is cutting them back...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's right for this...in this case it's for the vacancy savings, but the way the university works they have a little more leeway, they don't have PSL's and so they conceivably could fund a professor, but they may not have any books or tablets or whatever they chose to get the money (inaudible)...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: (Inaudible.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Do I see four hands in addition to Senator Robinson's? I do. Would the...the question before the body is, shall debate now cease? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bromm, to close.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Senator Wehrbein, could I ask you another question, if you would yield to a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. Senator Wehrbein, in the university budget is there, besides this amount, is there a 1 percent or some percentage of vacancy savings already built into the budget?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'll have to check that, Senator Bromm, I didn't...

SENATOR BROMM: Could you check that while I'm closing, if possible.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.
