SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I stand to support the Hall amendment and I just have to observe. I mean, how many...how many in here have fewer children than there were children in their family, when they were growing up? How many? I think family planning does work. You can't tell me it doesn't. And I think that my whole reason for getting up in support of this...of this particular amendment is that when we were talking about the welfare reform bill, or, excuse me, when we were talking about the funds for women who are pregnant, ADC payments, you know, we were talking about cutting off funding, and I...I really think that if we are going to punish people for being pregnant, we ought to at least be able to help them find ways and help them be in circumstances which they can avoid unplanned pregnancies, and I, for that reason alone, I would support this. But I also think that the agencies, themselves, do far more than just family planning services, and I don't know if you are aware of it or not, but most of these agencies also screen women for breast and cervical cancer, and do things like general physical assessments, blood pressure, hemoglobin checks, et cetera, et cetera. So they are really worthwhile agencies. I think that this is a good amendment, and I am in full support of it. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Landis. Senator Landis...are there four additional hands in addition to Senator Landis's? There are. The question is, shall debate now cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. While we are waiting for members to record their vote, let me introduce some more guests of Senator Wehrbein.
