SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just have a roll call in regular order.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. A roll call vote in regular order has been requested, and we are voting on the reconsideration motion to Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment. Senator Lindsay, would you...would the Clerk please call the roll. All in favor vote aye, opposed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2158 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion is adopted. I will raise the call Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I simply would move the amendment, or does that...

SENATOR CROSBY: On the amendment itself? Any further discussion on the amendment? Seeing none, are you waiving closing, Senator Bernard-Stevens?
