SENATOR CROSEY: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You have a straight backbone rather than a horizontal one because you are to stand, not creep and crawl.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen, on the Withem amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Now, Senator Chambers, I have always told Senator Chambers he'd be a wonderful law partner to have. I really would like Senator Chambers as a partner to go into court, take the complex and reduce it to a very simple concept because he is very good at doing that. But the problem is, as I have always told him, is that he probably would never charge the clients, and we'd probably go broke because we'd never send out a bill, and we'd probably wind up calling the judge a bootlicker before the trial is over, and then I'd get in all sorts of trouble, and then my client loses because Senator Chambers doesn't take a breath in between the five minutes and closing argument, just like he did. And then all of a sudden, I get all sorts of other problems that creep in. Actually, this morning's debate is a very good example of what happens when there is an additional judge pay bill out there, and probably that's the way it's been done for a number of years because it's a great opportunity for people to vent their frustrations and anger. And Senator Chambers is right, not every judge is bad. That doesn't mean that every judge is a rocket scientist and has Solomon written on the front of their forehead either. But what happens here is that, and the reason I rise to speak is not because of Senator Chambers, he is going to say what he is going to say anyway, and it's very clear why, and under what circumstances, and that it gives him a great opportunity. He is going to give that speech whether it is an appropriations bill, or a separate bill. But
