

make the changes necessary to reflect what we did do on Select File. Obviously, the full 500,000 is necessary to accomplish what we need to do on the bill, but...that you're not going to get revenue from the first year of the charge back; that may occur in the second year. There may be, I suppose, a...if there's a possibility that there may be a deficit at that time and we would have to come back and take care of that. But also, the Legislature, I think we can expect that there may be some federal funds that will come in and help to finance this, but this amendment basically corrects and reflects accurately what we did do on Select File. If we need to come back in the second half of the budget to look at that, I suppose that may be necessary but this does reflect the charge-back amounts that will be gained from the counties in the second year. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Is there any discussion on the Kristensen amendment? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the Kristensen amendment to LB 646A. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Kristensen.
