CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Lindsay amendment is adopted. We continue now with the discussion of the Lindsay amendment to LB 189. Is there any further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm waiting for an amendment which basically softens the last amendment that I proposed to you with the hope that there might be a couple more of you who are interested in progressing on this situation and so it will be necessary for me to file another amendment here and discuss it with you briefly and I think that can be a good discussion because there are other kinds of alternatives to this. And if it doesn't take very much longer, I will quickly get the amendment before you. It's a difficult situation when you have a total, brand-new amendment which you've seen for the first time just a few minutes ago to deal with that amendment in terms of properly prepared amendments to the amendment, but I will try to be quick about it and meanwhile there is another amendment that I would like to discuss with you. Thank you.
