I'm not saying it isn't. I just wanted to be sure as to what would happen to the money and/or can they stop paying. So thank you very much for answering my questions.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker and members, I'm going to address the practical side of this, what Senator Jensen wants to do. If I understand right your intent to take 2,000 feet now and then totally take all of the room in the second year, \$138,500? That takes the total rent out the second year?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: It is a 2,000 square foot, yes, that we're talking about. And it amounts to \$138,500 that second year, yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: For just the 2,000?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Not the...I thought that meant in the whole amount of the Public Service Commission.

SENATOR JENSEN: It would be then, yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So they would be on the, you're putting them on the street. I'm just saying this bill is a little premature. I know there are some that want to do away with Public Service Commission and I think that should be another issue at another time, not just take their space away. We do have a five-year lease on this building through 1997 and this is a legitimate
