

in the Natural Resources Committee which has been dealing with many of these issues all along in conjunction with a host of other issues which will be before us. So it would afford us far more opportunity I think than what we would have tonight if we got into the debate tonight on this stage of debate. So my intent as was agreed with Senator Landis, and unfortunately he is out of town and isn't able to be here, is to do just that, that at this stage when we're actually on the bill rather than on the amendment it would be my intention to not get into the full debate of actual LB 750, but to see if it's the will of the body to advance it to Select File and at that time we would then leave the bill sit, not bring it up on the agenda for the rest of the session. It most likely wouldn't come up on its own anyway and in the interim we would then be looking at what would be happening with what we do with the bill next year. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a priority motion. Senator Hall would move to bracket LB 750 until June 9, 1995.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. The bracket motion is up there for this reason, because the Beutler amendment is before us, the committee amendment is before us. There has been much discussion and I know Senator Preister and Senator Landis both have talked about advancing the bill over to Select File and I understand the desire to do that, but there's also a study resolution that has been put in as Senator Preister said that would very likely change the face of this proposal as it is before us. To attempt to advance it over to Select File is a gamble and far be it from me to be opposed to somebody who wants to gamble with their own legislation but the fact of the matter is, by adopting the bracket motion what you do is you leave the bill where it's at in its present position. It will be at the top of the list, it will be a senator's personal priority on General File. If it fails to advance to Select, it falls to the bottom of the list. Now it's not an issue of saying I don't want to necessarily deal with this subject matter and I wish Senator Landis were here so we could debate this measure. I would put this proposal up whether David was here or out of town, that's not any portion of this equation for me. It's just clearly I think that the measure, we can either walk
