Let's have the two rounds of debate, and treat it like we should any issue of this importance. That's why I think the rationale is there for the body to bracket it. This is not an anti-750 bracket motion.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Chambers, on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it is my sad duty to do some more garbageman work this morning. I have stayed out of the discussion of this bill, and I am not going to talk about the merits of the bill, but I am going to talk about the mispronunciation of a word, and it kills me and bothers me more than scraping fingernails over a chalkboard, and that is when they pronounce nuclear and "nucular". Think of clear, c-l-e-a-r, to make it as clear as I can. This is new information, nuclear, not "nucular" and you now like nucleus of a cell, and this comes from that. I have had so many people come to me, three, who are affected the same way that I am. Media persons do it, at the local level, at the national level. I have seen national correspondents, people who are called anchor creatures, and they will say "nucular". So for all who are within the sound of my voice, if you want to torture me, continue to pronounce nuclear as "nucular". If you want to seem to be educated, erudite, and literate, I am going to give some of my time to Senator Bernard-Stevens, say, nuclear, and, in fact,...

SENATOR HALL: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I will give him the rest of my time.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bernard-Stevens, you have approximately three and a quarter minutes.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I don't need that much time. Senator Chambers, I will refrain from saying nuclear, did I say that right? I said that right. I will try to not say it correctly to be nuclear, whatever that was, nuclear, if you will refrain from saying a word, mispronouncing a word that drives me crazy
