

may decrease some of the rights that communities and individuals have. We will talk about that. We will move it along, and it will pass, and, again, take effect the same day as if we bracket the bill. So I think for the body's sake, as far as discussion on a very important issue, that is very, very dangerous, potentially dangerous to many of our communities, I think they deserve to have at least two rounds of debate, if it is necessary. That is all the bracket motion does. I think it makes good policy sense, and I would urge its adoption.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. You've heard the close. The question is, shall the bill be bracketed. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think we will need to have a call of the house and I will accept call-in votes.

SENATOR HALL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And if we could have...Senator Schimek would like to have a roll call, if we could have the roll call vote in regular order.

SENATOR HALL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. Members, please record their presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Avery, if you could check in please. Thank you very much. Senator Bohlke, Senator Chambers. Thank you very much. Mr. Clerk, all unexcused members are present, if we could call the roll on the motion to bracket in regular order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2329-30 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR HALL: The bill is bracketed. I would like to announce that the coffee cake that was passed out to you this morning was in honor of Senator Engel's 63rd birthday. Happy birthday, Patrick. The call is raised. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.
