The second one will relate to the boot camp question. The third division deals with the equalization of cocaine powder and crack cocaine penalties. It's funny, I'm reading these off to you all, and I disagree with most of them, but, nevertheless, I want to let you know how we've agreed to proceed. And I can see Senator Abboud standing over there leaning on his book with one hand in his pocket grinning like a Cheshire cat. But, anyway, number four would require inmates to earn the awarding of good time within structured programming. The fifth would add violations of other states and federal laws as a premise to habitual criminal statutes being invoked. The sixth deals with probation officers salary equalization. The seventh will provide civil liability for terroristic threats, one of the nuttiest things I have seen us deal with so far. Number eight, the Enrollment and Review needs and that probably will be the least controversial of the items that we'll deal with. So this is the division that will occur, and any time that Senator Lindsay would like of what I have left to further comment, if necessary, I would yield to him.

**SPEAKER WITHEM:** Senator Lindsay, at this point, where Senator Chambers has made a request for the division, it appears to me as though it is an appropriate division of individual topics that could stand on their own. Do you have any comments on that? Are you accepting his request for division?

**SENATOR LINDSAY:** Yes, Mr. Speaker, I think it is clearly divisible, and because of that tried to work what were natural...seemed to be natural division lines handling the separate areas. The divisions that Senator Chambers suggested is acceptable. The order that is on your sheets that I think have been passed around is acceptable with one exception. I would ask that number eight, the E & R needs, that we go ahead and take that up first because I believe that shouldn't be controversial at all. So E & R amendments...

**SPEAKER WITHEM:** So you are agreeing to the division, which it is so ordered at this point. You are indicating you would like to bring these up in this order with the exception of item 8 you'd like taken up first?

**SENATOR LINDSAY:** Number eight first.
