SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm not sure under current law if good time applies. I believe it does to those mandatory terms that we have.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so elsewhere in this bill we're changing the relationship between good time and mandatory...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...minimum terms? Okay, so you're saying that if we approve another part of the bill then good time would not be subtracted from a mandatory minimum term. Is that right?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So if it's 25 years, whereas under the good-time law what is it, a third, or...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Half.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Half.

SENATOR LINDSAY: It would be twelve and a half.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It would be twelve and a half but if we approve the other section of the bill, it would still be 25 years.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No good time.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Is mandatory minimum terms, are they subject to parole?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Under current law, again. I'm not sure but I believe so, under the...under the bill, no.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So at no point in time for the 25 years, during that 25 years would they be subject to parole?
