

wheel of a car while drunk, chances are they aren't going to learn, and at some point you do have to step in and say at least from this offender we'll protect society. So that's what the amendment does in a nutshell. It...if we adopt this portion of the committee amendments, it adds motor vehicle homicide while under the influence, if you've been convicted twice or if the felony with which you're charged is that and one of your past ones is a motor vehicle homicide and one of the others is off the other list, it would add that same or it would increase the mandatory minimum term. I would urge the adoption of this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. You've heard the closing on the first section of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please. Somebody asked for a record vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 2339-40 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 5 nays on the adoption of the first component of the committee amendments, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: The section is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, if I may, one item for the record.

SENATOR CROSBY: All right.

CLERK: Senator Maurstad would like to print amendments to LB 613. (See page 2340 of the Legislative Journal.)

Senator Lindsay, I now have what I'm calling floor amendment 240 which is the second component of your committee amendments, establishment of boot camps. (See pages 2340-41 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, this is the section I think that might generate a little more interest from a broader section of the body, primarily because we're spending a lot of money on this one. This would...this provision would clarify the boot camp language in the bill. There will be an amendment offered, I believe, by Senators Bernard-Stevens and Withem to amend this portion of the amendment so as to strip boot camps from the bill. I would
