And I guess I should go with my knee-jerk reaction because I haven't heard anything that really convinces me that these are going to work, and I guess that's the only reason I stood up is just to say that at this time, because as I indicated earlier I might be thinking about supporting boot camps. And if you've got anything that you would like to say to try to change my mind at this time, you can use the rest of my time.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I guess I would simply state, Senator Schimek, that you know how people say don't do a knee-jerk reaction, and think these things through. But, no, actually that is...and I'm glad that...and I know you've been sitting here the whole time listening, going through these things, and I know you've thought that out. And there's...that is the issue we have to get to. That cost that you talk about is going to be lowered if you also factor in a reduced recidivism rate.
