

that path. So if we can assume anything from that, and maybe we can't, is that they're having a positive rather than a negative impact or experience with it.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Or they don't have anywhere else to put these people now that they've got them in boot camp.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Absolutely, and there is a lot of truth to that. And that's...we look at a construction cost of about \$120,000 a bed in a prison situation, much significantly...

SENATOR HALL: Time.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ...higher than this one.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Beutler, your light is next. Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We're voting on ceasing debate. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call of the house and take call-in votes, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Question is the house go under call. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
