

SENATOR ARBOUD: On...would Senator Lindsay yield to a...

SENATOR HALL: Senator Lindsay, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Be happy to.

SENATOR ARBOUD: Are we talking about the language on page 2 on your division sheet here? Is that...the second...second section?

SENATOR LINDSAY: No, we are talking now about that second section as amended by the Withem...

SENATOR ARBOUD: Withem amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ...Bernard-Stevens amendment, which changed the amendment into one, instead of which clarifies and expands boot camps to one that eliminates boot camps.

SENATOR ARBOUD: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR LINDSAY: It's an up or down vote now. Actually it's not quite that easy. No means yes to boot camps, yes means no boot to camps. That simple.

SENATOR ARBOUD: Okay.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Abboud. Seeing no other lights, Senator Lindsay, you're recognized to close on this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Hall, members. Only here can we say that yes means no, and that's what this vote would mean. And again, let me repeat so we know where we are. The committee amend...the bill as introduced included a boot camp component, so there is a boot camp component in the bill. The committee amendments clarified the boot camps, made sure all the language was in the correct shape. The Withem-Bernard-Stevens amendment stripped that language and inserted language which strips all of the boot camp language out of the green copy. So by adopting this amendment now we will be removing the boot camp language from the green copy. It's already been removed from the committee amendments, but now this...by adopting this amendment you would be removing that language from the green
