

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Chambers, we are still on your time.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: I will give you some of my time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just to clear the record, Senator Pedersen, you have no time to give, and Senator Chambers punched on and it's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...his time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then this would be my second time speaking?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: No, this is your first. We haven't run out of time. There is still about two minutes, and forty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Senator Pedersen, here's what I'm getting at, there is a provision in here about punishment if a person doesn't participate in these programs. Where in the amendment is that because we talked about it.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: I am looking for that myself, Senator Chambers. I think I left my amendment downstairs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, anyway, let me say what we have talked about, and if I am not stating it correctly, Senator Pedersen can correct me from memory. He mentions these various programs in this structured environment that a person must participate in, and I don't know if enough money is being appropriated to provide all those programs. So maybe that is a question that I'll ask preliminary to some of the others. Senator Pedersen, is enough money being appropriated, and is there staff available, or will there be staff available to provide all the programs that you listed in this amendment?

SENATOR PEDERSEN: I am not sure of that, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if a person is earning good time, and being punished if not in one of these programs, is what the law is going to say but not enough money is appropriated to have all
