

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, oh, and Senator Lindsay told me to say, and friends all, I know you all have been waiting for me to throw that atomic bomb, and I'm going to throw it on Senator Pedersen's amendment. I have waited patiently for this opportunity. To kind of lead up to it, some of you may not know anything about boxing but there's an elderly gentleman who is now the heavy weight champion of the world, and his name is George Foreman. He won the title by fighting a young guy who is very strong and awesome. You've got to watch these old, cunning veteran fighters. Senator Pedersen's jaw is hanging out there on this amendment and now I'm going to share with you this atom bomb. If you will turn to page 4 of the committee amendment, line 8, because I didn't have time to distribute it. My amendment strikes the word "ethics" and inserts "ethic". So here is why I'm doing it, I had talked to Senator Pedersen, because I didn't want to presume that they meant to say "work ethic". They could have been talking about ethics in the sense of giving an honest day's work for an honest day's pay, but the intent was to say ethic without an S. So rather than our saying it on the floor and then telling E & R to change it, it would be better to do it by way of an amendment, and that, Senator Witek, is my atomic bomb on this bill. And if you have any questions I will answer them, otherwise that will be all I'll have to say on this particular amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Chambers, for that explosive opening. Are there any further discussion on the Chambers amendment? Senator Witek.
