

that they just have to kind of pick themselves up and work at straightening themselves out without anyone else's help. And we can't help them at that point and they just have to make a determination, a self-determination that it's time to do that themselves. And maybe we try and try and try and will never be able to change some of those individuals until they change themselves. And you know as well as I do some of the ministries that are working in the prisons are politically incorrect, so they're never talked about. But they probably have at least the highest rate of helping individuals as any areas. And another area that's working is having private companies going to prisons and establishing those programs instead of relying on government money. But you know as well as I do there's a lot of special interest groups that have concerns when stuff like that happens. So we're not just talking about people who aren't willing to appropriate more money to these areas or people who aren't willing to help other people. There's a whole mix of what's going on in a lot of these decision-making areas. And all I'm saying is I hope that with the language that you have in this amendment that we don't...we aren't incurring more liability and more cost than we can afford in these areas. And I'm talking about afford in money, actual dollars. I know the chic thing to say is, you know, we can't think about those dollars, we have to think about those people. But at some point we have to think about those dollars because we're having problems paying for a lot of these things, and a lot of government programs that people have initiated, not because they are bad people, because they are usually good people who want to help others, but that's why we're having problems, because it seems like every program that somebody brings here is a good program wanting to help people and do good things. But there's so many of them out there that we just can't afford it anymore, and that's where we come to. And when you're talking about filling up the prisons and those kinds of things somewhere along the line we'll come to the realization that the reasons that this is happening is because people are making a decision to break the law, it's not any of these other areas that we try to reason it away with. It's that those individuals have decided that in some cases it's easier to...instead of to go work it's just easier to go steal something. You know, I mean these are personal decisions that people make, and they're decisions that they get caught for and have to pay for, to a society that doesn't want that to happen, that tries to control those wrong behaviors and those wrong decisions through incarcerating individuals. And, yes, some people are starting to initiate chain gangs because they say
