

feel that the earlier discussion was necessary for us to focus on what you say your intent is, even though I disagree with the 25-year mandatory minimum, we're talking about acts of violence and conspiracy is not that. If we struck conspiracy, I would have less concern about talking about these things that occur in other states.

SENATOR LINDSAY: But, as I mentioned, 28-202 is not...is not so vital to this bill that it's going to...

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ...I don't think it's going to have a great deal of effect because I don't think there is that many conspiracies to commit these particular acts.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that is not the kind of thing that's terrorizing people and actually causing harm to them. So if I would offer that amendment and not bother with this new language you're offering, even though I find problems with it, could you support the striking of that one provision about the conspiracy, 28-202?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes, I could support that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'm going to leave alone what you're doing now.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Is there any other discussion? Senator Lindsay, your light is next.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm just going to talk for a few seconds here while Senator Chambers drafts that and then I would support it and we would have the opportunity to vote on that particular subsection. What Senator Chambers is looking at doing is striking the language, I believe, on page 15, line 27 beginning with "or" through "sections" on line 28. And, as I mentioned, I don't think it's a...I mean, I can see, I can understand the point that he's making. The point that he's making is that the conspiracy itself, I don't think, is...there might...maybe ought to be some discretion in that area. It does not impact at all the question of the major crimes we're talking about which are murder, first degree, second degree, sexual assault, arson, acts that are very clearly acts which result in the...in the death of...or death or serious bodily injury of someone.
