SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Is there any other discussion? There...Senator Lindsay, your light is next.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, yeah, I do concur with this. It's...it's, as I mentioned, I don't think it's crucial to the bill, by any means. It's one that might be an enhancement of it, but it's certainly an amendment I can live with and I intend to vote for the amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Any other discussion? Seeing none, Senator Chambers, to close on the amendment. Waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would ask for a call of the house and I will take call-in votes.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you. There's been a request that the house go under call. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. All members please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. We are voting on the Chambers amendment to the committee amendments and Senator Chambers has authorized call-in votes. Senator Chambers, would you check in. Senator Avery. Thank you.
