

SENATOR HALL: The Chambers amendment is adopted. Anything further on this amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on this amendment, Mr. President. May I read a couple of items, however?

SENATOR HALL: Items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Withem has amendments to LB 189A to be printed; Senator Lindsay and Withem to LB 189A. That's all that I have. (See pages 2353-54 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We're back to this portion of the committee amendments. Senator Will, your light is on. Waives off. Seeing no other lights, Senator Lindsay to close on this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, I intend to file a cloture motion immediately after the vote on this...on this amendment. This amendment...what this portion of the committee amendments would do is to add violations, in addition to the amendment that was just adopted, it would add violation of other states and federal laws that are similar. If you have states, especially in those areas where you might have borders or given the transient nature of the population anymore, people moving from state to state, this makes it clear that people, if they commit a crime, a violent crime, in one state and move to another state, commit a similar crime, or move to Nebraska, commit a similar crime here, that a violation premised on one of the other states or under federal law would be included and taken into account under the habitual criminal statute. With that, I would urge that the body adopt this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. You've heard the close. The question is the adoption of this portion of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: This portion of the committee amendments is adopted.
