

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Technically, we have to wait and see if that actually happened, and we'd have to actually have the numbers here...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Depending on what you are saying, depending on what happens on LB 742 on Select File, right now it is 6, but it might, say we have some negotiations, we have an auction in here, and it ends up at 9, we spend 9, there would be 3 million left, that would be the 3 million that would go out of the 12.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: There is a really a maximum of 12 in our common understanding at this point.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: As long as the body knows what they are doing if they vote for this amendment. I will support it, but you need to know that it does take some money off the table, if you had anything else in mind, and I think Senator Bernard-Stevens wants to be clear about that. I don't mind taking money off the table and putting it in reserve to put it away. I tend to support that at this point, but you need to understand if you have other ideas in mind to spend, using some of the "saved money" in this area, this would, in effect, take that away. But I will support the amendment at this point.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Warner, your light is next.

SENATOR WARNER: Just briefly, it is not a bad idea but I think it is about one step too soon. I'd be much more comfortable on Select File to do this. I agree with the intent, but I'm not...I would be a little uncomfortable doing it at this point; that's explanation for my no vote.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Bohlke, your light is next.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President. Senator Warner just explained my no vote. I think it would be much more appropriate
