SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. Clerk, I understand there's an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kristensen would move to amend the Hall amendment. (Kristensen amendment, FA254, appears on page 2373 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I just briefly spoke with Senator Hall. What I would propose to do in his amendment is on page 2 on line 24, after the word "Supreme Court" also add "Court of Appeals", they're up in the tower as I understand right now, but they're also a constitutional court and would allow them to continue in and be part of this in the office allotment. I think, in my brief discussion with Senator Hall was that he didn't have a problem with that. So just to make sure that the Court of Appeals continues on. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We're now discussing the Kristensen amendment. Anybody to discuss the Kristensen amendment? Senator Chambers, on the Kristensen amendment? Senator Hall, on the Kristensen amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I just rise in support of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: No further lights on. Senator Kristensen. Waives. The question is the adoption of the Kristensen amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment to the Hall amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. We're now back discussing the Hall amendment. We have another amendment, I'm sorry.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend the Hall amendment,
