

CLERK: Senator Lindsay voting yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. Call is raised. Mr. Clerk, any further amendments to the Hall amendment?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hall, you are recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Again, with the various amendments that have been adopted, Senator Kristensen's and Senator Beutler's, I think the proposal is in good shape. Again you have my commitment that I intend to work with the parties involved so that we can get really what we need, and that is merely just five offices for 10 percent of this body. I don't think any one of us would object to that, I think it's appropriate that all parts of the state, their representatives, have the same opportunity in terms of the type of space necessary to provide the work product that the constituents deserve. With that, I would urge adoption of the amendment. I'd also like to thank Senator Lynch, who was kind enough to let me use LB 530 as the vehicle for this amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hall. Question before the body is the adoption of the Hall amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Hall's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill? Senator Lynch, two amendments I had printed, Senator. I had a note you wanted to withdraw both of those. Mr. President, Senators Wickersham, Beutler and Warner would move to amend.
