SENATOR JONES: I think you probably kind of answered my second question. I was going to ask you if it had a sunset, but you said you'd probably be now half way through with the study now?

SENATOR WESELY: Right, yeah, the study is just the phase 1 to give us the information to know how we wanted to move forward and get the system put in place.

SENATOR JONES: So we probably wouldn't have had this budgeted for another year after this?

SENATOR WESELY: No, this is one time. This is just one time. Yeah, it is not ongoing.

SENATOR JONES: Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I would like to call the question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question before you is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Brashear to close on his amendment.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Madam President, members of the body, I think we have had a good discussion on this. Senator Wesely has spoken to it with more detail than I can. I think there is no reason to abandon a study, which this body, in its wisdom, determined in 1994 we needed in order to be prepared to meet the future in terms of health care and the service to our people, and I urge the addition of the \$60,000 by the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.
