SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pedersen, you are recognized to close on your motion.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this again is moving the money, the bill itself is moving the money and the division and the Commission on Compulsive Gambling to the Division of...I mean, from that from DP...Department of Revenue to the Department of Institutions and it sets up criteria and certifies gambling counselors. The amendment changes from 10 percent of the money spent to a lid of \$50,000 a year for administration of this until we have enough income to live on the 10 percent. With that, I would encourage the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. The question is, shall LB 275E be returned to Select File? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Pedersen.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: I would reluctantly call for...have a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. We would invite members to check in, please. We are on Final Reading. Members should be in their seats at this point. Members, please check in. Senator Fisher, Senator Warner, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Robinson, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Schrock and Senator Elmer. Senator Robinson and Senator Elmer. And we'll let Senator Lynch come in too. Senator Pedersen, I'm assuming you want a roll call vote. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.
