

that is a small amount. I think the gun control ought to be put in there and ought to be in compliance with the federal government requirement. And if down the road at a future date we find out this is not necessary, other states are getting waivers, then perhaps we can go back and change it, but I think we do have a date. Am I not correct, Senator Bohlke, it's October 20th, and to your knowledge, Senator Bohlke, no other states are objecting to making this change?

SENATOR BOHLKE: There are four who are being reviewed for being at-risk.

SENATOR FISHER: Four states that are...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Being reviewed.

SENATOR FISHER: And they have the same type of policy that we have?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Well, as I said, the only waiver they've granted is Kentucky isn't in session, but for some reason, something that they have isn't in compliance.

SENATOR FISHER: Okay, thank you. And I think that, of course, any time when we see gun control, I get somewhat concerned about it but I think this is one that I would support without any reservation, and I would ask that you vote to suspend the rules and go ahead and to accept the amendment offered by Senator Bohlke. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Fisher. Senator Chambers, your light is next.
