SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you. Whatever time she needs, then if there's time left over, I would like to have the rest of it, but I will yield the beginning to, as much as she needs, to Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Withem, I'm open certainly to doing that tomorrow. I have another reason to ask the question at what time we may do this tomorrow.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You have a fairly busy day tomorrow, I know.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, and so are you thinking that we would take this up first thing in the morning tomorrow?

SPEAKER WITHEM: I don't know. Now you're asking me to shift gears here and talk about my scheduling role. I would commit to you that it would come back up again. I do not think it would override tomorrow's agenda because, as we now have the agenda set, as I understand it, we're dealing with 455 tomorrow, which could take a considerable amount of time. I'd be willing to amend the agenda, you know, to substitute that. I did not put it on the agenda, assuming that the bill would have been acted upon today. But I would have no problem putting it back in where its rightful spot on the agenda would be, between 455A and 742. If it wouldn't come up yet tomorrow, after the LB 455, I would commit to you that when we get back to Select File, which will be the next day, I believe, in some form...I'm trying to think through all of the scheduling options here. And I would commit to you the bill will come back up. This is not an attempt on my part to pull it off the agenda and leave it off the agenda. Exactly when it would come up might be late tomorrow, reinserted in that position, or it might be sometime the next day.

SENATOR BOHLKE: That's enough guidance. I mean, I knew you weren't attempting to do that. I just wanted to have it clear in my mind as I'm thinking of the process when that may be. I certainly support the amendment and I'll give my balance of time to Senator Bernard-Stevens.
